TASK FORCE OVERVIEW - Valerie Coleman

- Age Friendly movement description: Noted increased aging population, urban living, interest in independent living, “Ecology of aging,” Global movement along with growth of Dementia Friendly movements
- WHO Framework model for the world. 380 cities worldwide, Portland first US city, Santa Clara and Alameda rolling out Age Friendly efforts, opportunity to gain knowledge and share best practices from others.
- San Francisco is aging, disability and caregiver effort, intergenerational, diverse. Already a 3 year effort by the Aging and Disability Friendly SF Work group. Will reference their work.
- Method: Baseline assessment (assets and gaps), action plan, implementation & evaluation. Action plan will stay with LTCCC for follow-up and re-evaluation. Action plan addresses 8 domains, 4-8 recommendations each. “Actionable, Measureable, & Sensitive to Change.”
- Who: Task Force members, multidisciplinary, subject matter experts, diverse sources of information, older adults and people with disabilities, caregivers.
- Timeline: Baseline Assessment & Action Plan January through December 2017; Implementation 2017 through 2020; Evaluation 2020, Action Plan Update 2021.

- This task force is focused on long term planning.
- Task Force will not solve housing crisis
- Will Focus on actionable and measureable

- San Francisco values of equity, diversity, accessibility and inclusiveness
- Domains assist in focusing effort
- ADFSF is a lens through which the city can use in all its work so that older adults, seniors and people with disabilities are included in planning
