Update from Transportation workgroup –

Transportation update was provided by Cathy Spensley. The peer escort program is moving along, with funding worked out through DAAS until transportation funds from bond comes next year, at which time the program will continue and expand. Karen Garrison, Felton, is leading the project. The escorts are senior companions, and the pilot is operating through the Felton Senior Companion / Foster Grandparent program. Karen is recruiting now for escorts. The goal is to have 11-12; with 9 actively working and alternates. She has recruited 6-7 so far. If you have ideas for outreach, let Karen or Cathy know. Low-income seniors can get stipend, and the time worked is 20 hours per week.

There are 6 modules in the training program. There will be 2-3 sessions a week, 3 times a week. The escorts will ride on vans and will be working in the centers for last hour or so. This will assist with the transition from program to van to home. There are still some areas to work out, including routes and how volunteers will get home from routes. Question from group as to procedure if a client gets home and no one home or door locked. Will we track the people with dementia to see how works as model? This program has funding from Alzheimer's Association, so want to make sure it is focused on people with dementia. There is paratransit funding for this program for 3 years. Group suggested it is important to look at evaluation of the training; i.e., did volunteers find the training matched up with the actual work as escorts?

The group requested that the training curriculum plan be shared with group for review. Cathy will contact Karen with Ruth / Alzheimer's Association trainer.

This pilot will go live in September.

Update from LGBT workgroup –

Marcy Adelman updated group. The workgroup met with Scott Wiener's office about the LGBT dementia training model outreach to community, and shared the pilot the workgroup is developing. Wiener trying to get an RFP out in June that would provide funding for 2 years for training module for LGBT and dementia. The goal is to develop the training first, do some trainings, then do outreach. Want to have places to send folks and want to make sure sites are LGBT competent.

Request is in Mayor's budget for 200K to develop program.

Update on Alzheimer's Association Dementia Care Safety Net grant –

Joanne Robinson-Teran provided update on the project. The group is partnering with SF Village, openhouse and Little Brothers.

The pilot is to identify folks with Alzheimer's who live alone, and provide a case management approach over a 6 month period. The group is currently working with Brooke Hollister to develop tools and approaches.

The pilot would include 2-6 home visits, and care coordination, education, home safety, and referral to resources.

The second part of the grant is to identify needs and then people who might be involved with the identified person to join a care circle. This care circle would be provided with training, information on resources, information on technology to help keep the person at home and safe.

The group is currently finalizing assessments, tools to be used; and will then identify individuals through the partner organizations.

How will we establish rapport? – as outside agency – good to have partners. Doing presentations at partner agencies.

Coordination w/ individuals medical provider? – is this a part of this? –

Will do both – identified by agency and medical provider.

Will get referrals from ucsf, cpmc, Kaiser – some w/ formal dx and some w/out.

Will aks to have release signed.

Referral process – finalizing flyer, will get out to group. – flyer will have logo.

Will work w/ 40 individuals over the 2 year period.

Research project? – it is a program evaluation project. – new model being tested on programs we already offer. Not new but pulling things together, so not considered a research project.

Will have some type of consent so they know they can stop at any point.

Hope in this program to give some structure, training and support to these people who may form a care circle.

How will you measure capacity for consent? – will be acting as a care coordinator with other services. Will not have access to medical records. Felton does program called “WeCAre” that works in a residential senior housing. – they get consent from individual to talk w/ building swker. They have the consent signed at the medical provider not from their end. – work w/ ihss, building manager, custodial staff, - and thenc are coordinate. Use adl scale, gds, and mini-mental. Can give dx but can refer you to ucsfmemor yelinci or give them copy to give pcp.

Overlap of the cognitive screening and mental health. –

Goals are developed by the individual – what is working and what not working. – it is more of a grassroots effort. – not a medical model.

Individ might not know they hav an issue - what is long term care plan.
