

What is a Policy Body?

A policy body explores issues and concerns related to a topic or subject area, and develops proposed policies and recommendations, or more detailed plans, as a basis for some form of action.

- The LTCCC, as a policy body, is concerned with the development of an integrated network of home, community-based, and institutional long term services and supports (LTSS) for older adults and adults with disabilities.
 - It explores issues and concerns related to improving aspects of the LTSS delivery system.
 - It evaluates issues related to LTSS, including how different aspects of the service delivery system interact.
 - It oversees implementation activities and system improvements identified in the annual LTCCC Policy Agenda.
 - It makes recommendations about how to improve service coordination and system improvement.
- The LTCCC is an official advisory body to the Mayor's Office, is appointed by the Mayor, and provides policy guidance to the Mayor's staff.
- The LTCCC is the forum that people and organizations come to in order to learn about issues – or to inform about issues and concerns – in order to develop policies and recommendations related to LTSS.
