The Age & Disability Friendly Task Force meets at City Hall at 1 Dr. Carlton B Goodlett Pl, San Francisco, in room # 201. This building is between Van Ness Avenue and Polk Street (west and east respectively) and McAllister Street and Grove Street (north and south respectively). The closest accessible BART station is located at Civic Center. The following MUNI lines are accessible and are within one block, including: 5/5R, 49, 47, 24, 30, 54, 70, 92, 93, 100/101x, 90, 19, 21, 7x, and the F-Line streetcar that runs along Market St. For information about MUNI accessible services call 923-6142. City Hall is accessible to persons using wheelchairs and other assistive mobility devices. Wheelchair access is provided at the Grove, Van Ness and McAllister streets via ramps. Wheelchair access at the Polk Street/ Carlton B. Goodlett entrance is provided through a wheelchair lift.
