#### **ROAH 2.0**

ACRIA Update: Due to financial limitations the ROAH 2.0 study was put on hold. The recent partnership with Gay Men's Health Crisis in New York (see attached) allows ACRIA to restart the survey project on a stronger more secure basis with funds, administrative support, etc. ACRIA remains an independent organization. There are funds now for 200 surveys of which 103 have been completed. Incentive funds coming soon. ACRIA hopes that their survey can contribute to the Dignity Fund assessment process expected to end by February 2018. Rebecca has been in touch with the Dignity Fund Consultant.

<u>Next Steps</u>: Vince and Rebecca are working to schedule next surveys. Supervisor Sheehy's has been approached about looking for funds to survey long term survivors. Targeting 400 total surveys.

LTCCC Budget Asks: Without meetings in September and October no new HIV & Aging budget asks were submitted to LTCCC. The new LTCCC budget process is earlier and faster. HIV & Aging Work Group will support Housing Work group asks. Group discussed advocacy for the HAPN (HIV and AIDS Providers Network) ask including funds for Golden Compass (did not receive a grant from the Dignity Fund). Tez talked about his event last week (See slides from the ASS research town hall: <a href="http://bit.ly/ASSresearch">http://bit.ly/ASSresearch</a>) establishing the reality of the AIDS Survivors Syndrome (as separate from Complex PTSD). Recognizes need for mental health services, psychiatric services, intensive case management, support groups, etc. Previous comprehensive HIV & Aging Work Group budget asks are on record including housing and mental health.
